Board of Education Goals 2022-2023

St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES is committed to work successfully with component districts across the region:

- Continue to provide school districts and BOCES staff the information, resources, and training necessary to protect digital information, including Personally Identifiable Information (PII) of staff/students, and to protect our technology platforms.
- Develop resources to support BOCES and SLL component districts as they raise awareness and build capacity toward the implementation of the New York State Education Department's Culturally Responsive Sustaining Education Framework and the embedded components of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

- V. <u>2023-2024 BOCES Administrative</u>, Program, and Capital Budget (In accordance with <u>Board Policy #1310</u> – Power and Duties of the Board and Its Officers; with <u>Board Policy #4110</u> – Budget Planning and Preparation; and <u>Board Policy #4210</u> – Investments)
 - Rationale: Component Boards of Education met on Tuesday, April 18, 2023, the date designated by BOCES Board President to vote on the BOCES Administrative Budget and three BOCES board terms. The Administrative budget was approved by all 18 component school boards voting in favor. Todd Bates, Michael Miller, and Kevin Wells were elected to the three three-year board terms July 1, 2023 June 30, 2026.

- VII. <u>Education Service Center Region 19 Allied States Cooperative</u> (In accordance with <u>Board Policy # 4310</u> – Purchasing Policy)

A motion is needed to approve the participation in the ESC-Region 19 Purchasing (Allied States Cooperative) which is a national governmental purchasing cooperative which competitively bids and awards contracts to local, regional, and national vendors in compliance with local, state, and federal procurement laws and regulations.

Law §1950)

 - Rationale: Pursuant to §1950, subdivision 2-a(b) of the Education Law of the State of New York (in compliance with the BOCES Reform Legislation, 1993), the president of the BOCES shall designate a single date on or after the 16th date and on or before the 30th date of April on which each component board shall conduct a public meeting which may be a regular or special meeting, for the purpose of electing members of the BOCES and adopting a public resolution concerning the approval of disapproval of the tentative administrative budget.
