Shall the Board of Cooperative Educational Services for the Sole Supervisory District of St. Lawrence and Lewis Counties, New York (the "BOCES"), be authorized: (a) to construct additions to and reconstruct the BOCES career and technical education centers, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, site improvements, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, at an aggregate maximum estimated cost of \$43,500,000 (the "Project"), and in furtherance thereof (b) to expend \$500,000 Capital Fund monies therefor, and (c) to enter into any and all agreements and instruments necessary or desirable to effectuate a financing for said Project in an amount not to exceed \$43,000,000 through the auspices of the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York ("DASNY"), or otherwise, including, but not limited to, authority to convey to DASNY such specific interests in real property or leasehold interests, including all or any portion of the Project and to enter into any lease or other agreement with DASNY, as may be necessary to effectuate said financing.
