Board of Education Goals 2021-2022

VIII. Revenue Anticipation Note Resolution (RAN)

(In accordance with Board Policy #4510 – Facilities Planning)

Rationale: The necessity of borrowing is due to the lack of revenue during the summer.

This is an annual request and the loan is repaid by fiscal year end, June 2022.

A motion is needed to delegate the president of the Board of Education of the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of the Sole Supervisory District of St. Lawrence and Lewis Counties, New York, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell not exceeding \$7,000,000 revenue anticipation notes of said B.O.C.E.S. in anticipation of the receipt of revenues from various sources during the fiscal year of said B.O.C.E.S. commencing July 1, 2022:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of the Sole Supervisory District of St. Lawrence and Lewis Counties, New York, as follows:

- Section 1. The power to authorize the issuance of and to sell revenue anticipation notes, including renewals thereof, of the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of the Sole Supervisory District of St. Lawrence and Lewis Counties, New York (the "B.O.C.E.S."), in anticipation of the receipt of revenues from various sources during the fiscal year of said B.O.C.E.S. commencing July 1, 2022, including receipt of moneys from the State of New York and from component school districts, is hereby delegated to the President of said B.O.C.E.S., the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be determined by said President pursuant to the Local Finance Law.
- Section 2. The deputy chief fiscal officer of said B.O.C.E.S. is hereby authorized to execute such revenue anticipation notes in the place of the chief fiscal officer, if the chief fiscal officer shall so designate.
- Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

IX. Installment Purchases

(In accordance with Board Policy #4310 – Purchasing Policy)

Rationale: The Board of Education finds and determines that it is in St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES' best financial interest to acquire the equipment for the benefit of the District because:

- It provides an opportunity to use the equipment without committing to the full costs of purchase; and
- After seeking competitive quotes, Lessor provides the most financially advantageous lease terms.

A motion is needed to approve the installment purchases for:

 Norwood-Norfolk Central School District for four (4) network printers with Xerox which is contingent on the Norwood-Norfolk CSD Board of Education approval on April 24, 2022.

The equipment is being purchased through CoSer 506, Instructional Technology. In accordance with NYS Education Law, installment purchases require approval by board resolution and approval by the State Education Department.

X. Change May 2022 Board of Education Meeting Date and Time

XI. School Counselor – Shadowing

Rationale:

Ms. Ellie Owens is a SUNY Potsdam undergraduate student interested in shadowing on Fridays at Northwest Technical Center under Matthew Hosmer, school counselor through the end of May 2022. Ellie is interested in exploring the field of school counseling. She is a senior with a major in Psychology and a minor in Wilderness Education.

A motion is needed to approve the School Counselor - Shadowing, Ellie Owens, unpaid, every Friday from 4/1/2022 through May 20, 2022, to shadow Matthew Hosmer, School Counselor at Northwest Technical Center, Ogdensburg, New York.

XII. Lease of SLLBOCES Office Space

(In accordance with Board Policy #4510 – Facilities Planning)

A motion is needed to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the St. Lawrence-Lewis Board of Cooperative Educational Services ("the BOCES") is desirous of leasing unneeded facilities and is subject to New York State Education Law § 1950 and corresponding Commissioner's Regulation 155.14; and

WHEREAS, the Development Authority of the North Country ("DANC") and the BOCES are desirous of entering into the lease agreement attached hereto.

WHEREAS, among other things, the lease agreement specifies that DANC shall only use the leased facilities for purposes permitted by the Consolidated Laws of New York, Public Authorities Law Ch. 43-A, Article 8, Title. 29 ("the development authority of the north country act").

WHEREAS, the BOCES has made a study and does not anticipate a need for the leased property during the term of the proposed lease; and

WHEREAS, the BOCES has determined that the annual amount of rental payment is not less than the fair market rental value; and

WHEREAS, BOCES has determined that such lease is in the best educational and financial interest of the board.

BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1.) That the Board of Education of the St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES does hereby approve the execution of the lease agreement with DANC, attached hereto; and
- 2.) The Board of Education of the St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES directs District Superintendent Burns to execute same; and
- 3.) The Board of Education of the St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES authorizes the carrying out of all obligations in the attached lease agreement in accordance with its terms.
